<p>Chairman's Welcome</p>	<p>Meeting started at 5.35pm</p> <p>The Chair(Andy Winter) welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited the club President (Margaret Morris) to say a few words and open the meeting. Margaret opened the meeting by thanking everyone for coming and acknowledging it was nice to see so many attendees. She thanked the committee for its work over the season, the Coaches and Volunteers as</p>

	<p>well as Tony and Pauline for looking after Betty's Roll ups. (Detailed speech is attached in the Annual Reports for 2024/25)</p> <p>Andy gave a brief overview of how the meeting would unfold. A Presentation on the screen would accompany each section. (Copies of the slides can be found on our website along with all other papers from today's meeting).</p>
Minute of Silence	<p>All attendees stood for a moments silence to commemorate the bowlers we lost over the last year. Those remembered were Ron Higgins and Dave Phipps.</p>
Minutes	<p>The minutes of last year's meeting were presented for approval by the meeting.</p> <p>All were in favour of the Minutes of last year's AGM with a unanimous show of hands. There were no oppositions or points raised.</p> <p>Copies of the minutes were circulated to each table for those who do not have access to the Website.</p>
Annual Reports	<p>Andy explained that all of the Annual Reports had been uploaded on the Website for everyone to view.</p> <p>The attendees were then invited to put forward any questions. None were forthcoming and a show of hands approved all of the Annual Reports.</p> <p>Copies of the Annual Reports were circulated to each table for those who do not have access to the Website.</p>
Finance	<p>Terry Humphreys noted the Financial Report for the season ending March 31st 2025 is available on the Website.</p> <p>1.Total Operating Profit:£3,193 (After Charity donations of £2,220) Hub Profit:£2,184 Profit on Core Activity: £1,009</p> <p>2. Total Paid to Charities:£2,220 (made up of £1,220 raised in the current year plus £1,000 from 2023/24). In previous years these donations were paid in arrears but have now been regularised for payment in the year in which funds are raised. Charities for 2024/25 were Katharine House Hospice and Banbury Young Homeless Persons (BYHP).</p> <p>3. Shirt Donations:£1,000 received and to date £450 paid out to members</p> <p>4. One-off payments:£597 for equipment (mats, bowls stickers & banner)</p>

	<p>5. Charitable Grant:£2,704 from Banbury Charities for Youth Academy – we have invested £2,715 in 11 sets of junior bowls, 4 sets of tabards and additional jacks</p> <p>6. No payment for BIAS this year but £800 is due for 2025/26 + £700 for 2025/26.</p> <p>7. Bank Balances: Current Account £4,954. Deposits: £5,200 was transferred from the Current Account to Deposit and a new 95-day Access Account has been opened (Balance £10,118 currently paying 3.01%). £1,044 remains in the Instant Access Account @ 1%. £58,646 in Hampshire Trust 2-Year Bond paying 4.6%, due to mature June 2025</p>
<p>Proposals</p>	<p>The only proposal was from the Committee, to adopt a new constitution. This was to update our current governing document but also to ensure that we were fit to apply for Community Amateur Sports Club status which will give us similar tax advantages that are enjoyed by charities. This new Constitution had been circulated to all members for consultation and then with the AGM notice and papers. It is also available on the website</p> <p>Michael Morris raised a point that in 2009 Banbury Borough investigated the process of going down the same route however they found that should the club go through dissolution the funds in the clubs accounts would not be permitted to be given back to the members.</p> <p>Andy advised that it had never been the intention of the club to distribute funds to members if it folded, both the old and the new constitution had taken this into account and it is noted that if the club should dissolve the funds would be awarded to a Sports Club similar to ours.</p> <p>There were no further points raised and the new Constitution was unanimously approved. The new Constitution is formally in place as of 15th April 2025.</p> <p>Andy also noted that at the last AGM there was a proposal for the club to enter the Wessex League. The Committee had sounded this out along with suggestions for the National Mixed Top Club and the Men's Over 60's Double rink. We did not get enough names for the Wessex League however we are pleased to say we have enough names to enter teams for both the Mixed Top Club and the Men's Over 60's Double rink. He advised that the lists are still up on the board for anyone who may wish to enter and has not done so yet. However, these lists will be taken down at the end of the meeting.</p>
